#### 1. PMMVY:

To achieve the SDG-1, **P**radhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) is being implemented in the State with the objective to uplift the nutritional and health status of pregnant ladies and nursing mothers and infants. Under this scheme, all women of 19 years of age and above, shall receive Rs.5000/- in three instalments, (Rs. 1000+2000+2000) on the birth of first live child, subject to the fulfilment of specific conditions under the scheme.

#### 2. Social Security:

- a. The department provides social security to the poor and marginalised population by providing a monthly pension of Rs. 750/- to Senior citizens, Widow and Destitute Women, Dependent children and Persons with Disabilities.
- b. Female Acid attack Victims' are provided a monthly pension of Rs.8000/-.
- c. The department also provides monthly assistance of Rs. 2000/- to children of poor families under the Sponsorship program under ICPS.
- d. Attendance Scholarship is provided to children with disabilities in urban and rural areas and girls with disabilities in rural areas.
- e. Under NSAP Schemes(100% Centrally Sponsored Schemes) the rate of pension is as below:-

In above Scheme, @500 p.m is given if the age of beneficiary is above 80 yrs.

# SDG-02 End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

- 2.1 By 2030, end hunger and ensure access by all people, in particular the poor and people in vulnerable situations, including infants, to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round.
- 2.2 By 2030, end all forms of malnutrition, including achieving, by 2025, the internationally agreed targets on stunting and wasting in children under 5 years of age, and address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women and older persons

The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme is one of the flagship programmes of the Government of India and represents one of the world's largest and unique programmes for early childhood care and development. It is the foremost symbol of country's commitment to its children and nursing mothers, as a response to the challenge of providing preschool non-formal education on one hand and breaking the vicious cycle of malnutrition, morbidity, reduced learning capacity and mortality on the other. The beneficiaries under the Scheme are children in the age group of 0-6 years, pregnant women and lactating mothers. Objectives of the Scheme are:

- to improve the nutritional and health status of children in the age-group 0-6 years.
- to lay the foundation for proper psychological, physical and social development of the child.
- to reduce the incidence of mortality, morbidity, malnutrition and school dropout.

- to achieve effective co-ordination of policy and implementation amongst the various departments to promote child development.
- to enhance the capability of the mother to look after the normal health and nutritional needs of the child through proper nutrition and health education.

#### SDG- 5 Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls:

- **5.1** End all forms of discrimination against all women and girls everywhere
- **5.2** Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls in the public and private spheres, including tracking and sexual and other types of exploitation
- **5.3** Eliminate all harmful practices, such as child, early and forced marriage and female genital mutilation
- a. To achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls under SDG-5, various schemes, i.e. Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) scheme, One Stop centre scheme (OSC), universalization of women helpline etc. are being run in the state. Under BBBP, efforts are being done in the form of various awareness activities i.e functions; seminar, rallies, play, competitions awareness camps etc are being run to raise child sex ratio each year, by10 points in the state.
- b. OSC scheme is implemented in the State to provide an integrated range of services including medical, legal, and psychological support for Women affected by violence.
- c. In addition to this, Universalisation of Women Helpline (WHL) scheme is also implemented in the State to provide 24 hours immediate and emergency response to women affected by violence through referral (linking with appropriate authority such as police, One Stop Centre, hospital) and information about women related government schemes programs across the country through a single uniform number 181.
- d. Attendance Scholarship is provided to children with disabilities in urban and rural areas and girls with disabilities in rural areas.
- e. Under the Bebe Nanaki Ladli Beti Scheme insurance cover of Rs. 61,000/- is provided to girls of poor families.
- f. Under the Mai Bhago Vidya Scheme, bicycles are given to girls of class XI and XII, studying in Government schools so that they can travel to higher secondary Schools which are away from their homes, thereby reducing girl drop out ratio.

  - An intensive monitoring mechanism with regular meeting and inspection by the Head Office as well as by District teams has been put in place to ensure proper implementation of schemes.
- v. Grievance Redressal:-
  - Time bound action on grievances received through various forums such as PB PGRAMS, CM Grievances Portal or directly is being ensured.
  - Dedicated HELPLINE has been setup in the department to guide regarding schemes as well as receive complaints.
