PLAN PERFORMANCE

In 11th Plan target for growth of state's economy - fixed at 5.90%.

- Economic growth during the first three years of the plan has been 6.88%, 6.40% and 6.69%.
- 16 flagship schemes expenditure up from 70% to 84%

(f) Additional Resource Mobilization:

Committed to raise additional resources to the extent of Rs. 1200 crore in the current financial year.

- 10% surcharge on VAT (Rs 600 crore);
- increase in the VAT rate from 4% to 5% for some major items (Rs. 100 crore);
- Imposition of tariff on agricultural power consumption (Rs. 500 crore);
- rationalization of power subsidy for SC and BPL families (Rs. 120 crore); enhancement in Electricity Duty from 10% to 13% (Rs. 270 crore) and
- Imposition of irrigation cess (Rs.120 crore).

(g) <u>Higher Tax Revenue</u>: Through better compliance

VAT (state share)- up from Rs.7577 cr to Rs 9600 cr Stamp Duty - up from Rs 1550 cr to Rs 2395 cr Liquor Excise - up from Rs 2000 cr to Rs. 2520 cr

Capital Assistance by the Planning Commission

However, State's efforts have to be reinforced by a major capital assistance by the Planning Commission and the Central Government.

• Annual Plan 2010-11 is Rs. 9050 crore (5% higher)

<u>Agriculture</u>

• Punjab has contributed the maximum for food security.

Canal Irrigation

- Area under canal irrigation has reduced from
 16.6 lac Ha to 11 lac ha (about 30%)
- Immediate need to rehabilitate, rejuvenate and strengthen the canals, minors and field channels.
 <u>Ground Water</u>
- Water table has depleted due to overdrawl.
- Expert committee should be constituted
 <u>New Technology and Research</u>
- Agriculture research must be strengthened to evolve new varieties which are *high yielding*, *Pest resistant*, *Less water consuming*.
- Borlaugh Institute for South Asia (BISA) for Maize and Wheat improvement
- Soil Health
- Due to intensive cultivation, the soil health has depleted.
- Farmer has to use more fertilizers and micro nutrients.
- Therefore supply of micro nutrients should be subsidized
 - **Remunerative Prices**
- Prices should be fixed by providing a margin of 50% over the cost of production as suggested by Dr. Swaminathan.

Need to create and strengthen the marketing infrastructure

Storage – Silos

<u>Debt</u>

- Rural debt in Punjab today Rs.36,000 Cr
- Waive all agricultural loans as one time measure <u>Credit</u>
- Credit @ 4% rate of interest, (short as well as long term)
- <u>Compensation for crop damage</u>
- Central government's current practice very meager. Compensation should be provided to cover total loss of the crop which should be equivalent to the average yield of the crop of the state.
- Areas having assured irrigation facilities The

compensation should be linked to deficiency in rainfall.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT

- Expenditure under NREGA 110% compared to last year
- Current year's allocation of Rs 212.00 Cr is still very meager
- Scope to include i) Toilets for SC and BPL families
 - ii) Lining of distributaries, minors and water courses
 - iii) Boundary walls for Schools and hospitals
 - iv) White Washing of government buildings

- Currently 11% (But SC population 29%)
- Tendulkar committee report 20.4% be accepted
