

**ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT OF ECONOMIC AND STATISTICAL  
ORGANISATION, PUNJAB 2005-2006**

Economic and Statistical Organisation acts as the data bank and caters to the statistical needs of the State as well as Central Government, policy makers and research institutions and individual researchers. The Organisation collects primary as well as secondary data at the state, district, block and village level. The data thus collected is compiled, analysed, interpreted and disseminated through various departmental publications. This Organisation also coordinates statistical activities within the State and keeps proper liaison with Central Statistical Organisation, Government of India.

Economic & Statistical Organisation also undertakes evaluation studies concerning plan programmes /schemes at the instance of State Govt. These reports not only help in formulation of development programmes, but also identify the bottlenecks for taking corrective measures in their implementation.

“Statistical Abstract of Punjab” and “Economic Survey of Punjab” are two widely known annual publications of this Organisation which contain comprehensive data-based information on various socio-economic aspects in the State. Both of these publications are Budget Documents .

Economic & Statistical Organisation is headed by Economic Adviser who is assisted by Directors, Joint Directors, Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers, Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers.

Economic & Statistical Organisation has 17 regular sections . Besides 3 more sections i.e. MPLAD ,HDR&CU & Economic Census are working at the State Head Quarter. One section works for the establishment and the remaining sections are engaged in data -based & research oriented technical work. The establishment section manages the human resource administration and is manned by superintendents, senior assistants, clerks and typists. The Directors, Joint Directors and Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers provide tips of desired guidance in day to day research work on matters relating to Economics and Statistics. The Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers are mainly responsible for analysis and interpretation of data whereas collection and compilation work is done by Investigators and Statistical Assistants.

There is a District Statistical Office in each of district of the State headed by Dy. Economic & Statistical Adviser. With the introduction of decentralised planning, Deputy Economic and Statistical Adviser also acts as Additional Secretary of the District Planning and Development Board and is fully involved in the formulation and monitoring of the plan schemes. (A chart showing the administrative set up and distribution of the work of various sections of Organisation is enclosed at the end of the report.)

The activities and the assignments completed by each section/unit during 2005-2006 are given below:-

### **I. STATE INCOME**

This Section prepares estimates of State Domestic Product (SDP) both at current and at constant (1993-94) prices for all the fifteen sectors of the economy along with per capita income regularly with a time lag of two years. District-wise sectoral estimates of SDP both at current and constant prices for each year are also prepared. Quick estimates of SDP based on production targets of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry and Fishing sectors are prepared annually

with a time lag of one year. Sector wise growth rates of SDP for different periods are prepared to study the trend of State's Economy. In addition to it, notes on economic situation in the state and comparative position of the states' vis-à-vis other states with respect to State Domestic Product are prepared for the use of State Government.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

1. The following estimates of SDP at current and constant (1993-94) prices were prepared for all the fifteen sectors of the economy.
  - (a) Provisional Estimates of Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) and Net State Domestic Product (NSDP) for the year 2003-2004.
  - (b) Quick estimates of GSDP and NSDP for the year 2004-2005
  - (c) Revised estimates of GSDP and NSDP for the year 2001-2002 and 2002-2003 at current and constant (1993-94) prices.
  - (d) District-wise estimates have been prepared for the year 1999-2000 to 2002-03 at current and constant (1993-94) prices.
2. Information regarding economic situation and growth rates were prepared for inclusion of budget speech of Finance Minister, Punjab. Required information for Governor's address in Budget Session of Punjab was also supplied.
3. Information regarding average annual compound growth rate of GSDP relating to 10<sup>th</sup> plan from 2002-03 to 2004-05 were prepared and sent to Planning Board.
4. Growth rates of Primary, secondary and tertiary sectors of different states are prepared for the year 2002-03 and 2003-04.
5. Following data was sent to Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
  - (a) Comparable sectorwise data on State Domestic Product for the year 2001-02 to 2002-03 at current & constant prices.
  - (b) Data relating to employment and compensation of employees of Municipal Committees/Corporations under Water Supply sector.
  - (c) Information regarding slaughtered animals of Livestock sector for the year 2003-04.
  - (d) Information regarding production, prices and area under agriculture crops for agriculture sector for the year 2003-04.
6. Gross State Domestic Product on current and constant prices was sent to A.G. Punjab.
7. Answer of starred question No. 1620 regarding Per Capita Income was prepared. After the approval of Hon'ble Finance and Planning Minister, Punjab the desired copies were sent to Punjab Vidhan Sabha.
8. Information regarding GSDP from 1990-91 to 1992-93 at 1980-81 prices and from 1999-2000 to 2003-04 at 1993-94 prices was sent to Punjab State Electricity Board.
9. Sector wise information was prepared to attend the All India workshop cum training on new series with new base year of 1999-2000. This workshop was organized by Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India from 3.4.06 to 7.4.06 at Hyderabad, which was attended by the officers/officials of this section.

## **II. PUBLIC FINANCE**

This section undertakes economic analysis of State Govt. budget and budgets of Municipal Councils/Corporations. Macro economic data regarding Public Finance is maintained and supplied for various uses.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

1. Economic & Purpose Classification of Punjab Govt. budget for the year 2003-2004 and report for the year 2004-05 computerised/ prepared and got approved from competent authority. The classification of Punjab govt. Budget as per new series for the year 1999-00 to 2004-05 sent to C.S.O. Govt. of India.
2. Economic & Functional Classification of Municipal budgets Punjab combined for the year 2003-2004 and 2004-05 were prepared manually.
3. Statistics of Public Finance, Punjab for the year 2002-2003 was computerized and that of year 2003-04 is under computerization after approval.
4. Miscellaneous
  - (a) Information of 5 Autonomous bodies from 1999-2000 to 2004-05 was sent to C.S.O. ,Govt. of India.
  - (b) As per requirement of C.S.O. Govt. of India coordination was made with Finance Department & Planning Department to collect quarterly data of expenditure of Revenue Account and Capital Account for the years 2002-03 to 2005-06. This information of planside was collected from Planning Department and sent to CSO, Govt. of India.

### **III. CAPITAL FORMATION**

This section prepares estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation for all the 13 sectors of the economy at current as well as at constant (1993-94) prices both for public and private sectors. These estimates were compiled asset wise, institution wise and industry wise for the state as a whole. Besides, this section is also making attempts to prepare the estimates of consumption of fixed capital (CFC) for nine sectors of the economy with the help of Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

1. Estimates of Gross Domestic Capital Formation for the year 2003-2004 at current and at constant (1993-94) prices were prepared by type of assets and by type of institution for all the 13 sectors of the economy.
2. Economic Survey for the year 2005-06 was prepared and got published.
3. Estimates of Gross Fixed Capital Formation for the year 1993-94 to 2002-03 at current and constant (1993-94) prices ,Industry wise and assesstwise were prepared and sent to Central Statistical Organisation, New Delhi.

### **IV. EMPLOYMENT**

The Advisory Committee of Economists set up by the Planning Commission to examine the recommendations of Dantawala Committee of experts recommended that suitable surveys and studies be undertaken in the field of employment and man power. Keeping in view the above, the Punjab Govt. established an employment cell in Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab for conducting the studies under the schemes "Impact on Employment in Command Areas of Industrial and Power Projects and spread its effect on the Employment in the adjoining areas." The Employment section has conducted twelve studies so for.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

On the basis of information received from Director, Food & Supplies Punjab and Director, Employment, Punjab two tables each regarding retail rates charged by the fair price shops, distribution of essential commodities and employment in the organized sector, no. of job seekers on the live register of employment exchanges were prepared and sent to concerned section for its inclusion in Economic Survey 2005-06. Besides this, the chapters 'Employment' and 'Public distribution system' were also prepared for their inclusion in Economic Survey 2005-06.

## V. INDUSTRIAL STATISTICS

This section was set up in 1967-68 in E.S.O. with the objective of collection and compilation of industrial statistics in the State. Main function of this section is, preparation of Annual State Summary results for registered manufacturing sector and compilation of index of industrial production (IIP) for selected important items. For State Summary results data collected through Annual Survey of Industries by NSSO are used which provide statistical information to assess and evaluate objectively and realistically the change in the growth, composition and structure of the organised manufacturing sector. To make the best and timely use of data available under Annual Survey of Industries on regular basis, duplicate copies of the ASI schedules in respect of Punjab State are obtained from the field offices of NSSO located at Jalandhar & Ludhiana. After due scrutiny and tabulation process provisional results on some key parameters are released and are finalised with the approval of Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India. In debriefing workshops of Group I states of the study for identifying specific requirements for strengthening of State Statistical Bureaus (Phase-I) under India Statistical Strengthening Project held on 21.3.2006 at Delhi. It has been decided to stop compilation of ASI schedules by the States. Compiled statement will be provided by the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta. State will further tabulate data as per requirement.

On the recommendations of CSO (Govt. of India) this section has been compiling State Level Index of Industrial Production (IIP) annually as well as quarterly with base year 1993-94=100. For this purpose a number of 904 Industrial Units/factories were selected for 109 items. Production of Electricity as well as Sulphur has also been taken into account for the compilation of this IIP.

### During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

1. All the filled in schedules/units (2461) received from Regional Offices of N.S.S.O. for the year 2003-04 were scrutinised and discrepancies found in the schedules were reconciled with the concerned offices of NSSO (FOD) located in the State.
2. After compilation of 1st stage, Industry groupwise and districtwise estimates of ASI for some key item for the year 2003-04 (P) were prepared on the basis of data collected through annual survey of Industries. These summary results at two digit level of NIC 1998 were published in the State Abstract 2005.
3. State quarterwise and Annual Index of Industrial Production (IIP) for the year 2003-04 (P) with base year 1993-94=100 for the selected 111 items two digit level of NIC-1987 were prepared and sent to the CSO (G.O.I) for information. These comparative indices were released for the State Statistical Abstract-2005 and Economic Survey 2005-2006. On the recommendations of CSO (GOI) item basket for the new base year 1999-2000 has been sent to CSO, Govt. of India for approval.

## **VI. PLAN EVALUATION**

This section was set up in the Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1964. The evaluation section is engaged in evaluating various programmes/ schemes being implemented by various departments. These reports are helpful to the planners and administrators in formulating the schemes/programmes which help in taking the corrective measures for removing the bottlenecks. Besides this section undertakes con-current quick evaluation of different development schemes. Since its inception this section has conducted 173 evaluation studies.

### During the year 2005-2006 following evaluation studies were conducted:-

Sports Scholarship Scheme Report finalized by E.A./sent to Planning Department and Report got approved by Secretary Planning.

## **VII. COMPILATION**

Compilation section acts as data bank in the department. Wide range of data is made available comprehensively to the State Administrators, planners and researchers so as to take important decisions in formulating and implementing the departmental schemes and for undertaking research work in the State. This section also coordinates statistical activities between Govt. of India and various states.

### During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

1. Statistical Abstract of Punjab, 2005 was prepared and got published and was presented in the budget session of Punjab Vidhan Sabha.
2. Administrative Report for the year 2004-05 was prepared in English and computerized.
- 3 .Annual Administrative Reports for the year 2003-2004 got computerized in English and Punjabi.
- 4 .Punjab at a Glance District-wise for the year 2004 was prepared and computerised.
5. Punjab at a Glance district-wise for the year 2003 was computerized and finalized and got approved.
6. Citizen Charter of the department was prepared and got approved and task force was constituted.
7. Field study for identifying the specific requirements under strengthening of State Statistical system in India, Tier-1 by JPS Associates (P) Ltd. was helped/co-ordinated. In this regard, the information from various departments and sections of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab was collected.
8. Information for the quarterly Statistical Newsletter for the quarters ending 3/2005, 6/2005, 9/2005 and 12/2005 and half yearly report for the half year ending 6/2005 and 12/2005 with regard to National Advisory Board on Statistics was sent to C.S.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.
9. Material for the Governor's and Finance Minister's Address for the budget session 2006 was prepared and supplied.

## **VIII. PRICES**

For studying the behavior of prices especially under inflationary pressures, wholesale and retail prices are collected every week. From these prices, monthly price bulletins are prepared. Consumer Price Index Numbers for the working class in Punjab are prepared every month for six centers viz. Abohar, Bathinda, Dhariwal, Nangal, Patiala & Phagwara

and supplied to State Government departments and the concerned Industrial units for providing relief to factory workers due to increase in prices. Data regarding rural retail prices and Agriculture Labour wages are collected and circulated for the information of Central and State Government departments every month. The monthly report of monitoring of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities is prepared.

During the year 2005-2006 the following assignments were completed.

1. Consumer Price Indices (Base 1987=100) for the working class for six selected centres were prepared and issued from 2/05 to 2/06.
2. Wholesale Price Bulletin from 1/2005 to 2/2006 were prepared.
3. Statements of Agricultural Labour Wages and Rural Retail Prices from 2/05 to 1/06 were prepared and sent to Agriculture department Punjab from 1/05 to 1/2006.
4. The monthly report of monitoring of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities were prepared from March, 2005 to February, 2006.
5. A chapter relating to Prices was prepared for Economic Survey 2005-2006.
6. A chapter of prices (containing 14 tables) was prepared for state Statistical Abstract 2005.

### **VIII. FIELD OPERATION**

The Field Operation section of Economic & Statistical Organisation Punjab was set up with the primary objective of improving the quality of statistics at Block and village level and also to collect additional primary data on various other important socio- economic aspects at village and block level which hitherto was not collected by any other agency. In the present scenario as the concept of Block/Micro level planning is gaining popularity, block level statistics have become more important. These blockwise/villagewise statistics are in great demand from various Government Departments and Organisations especially for the purpose of decentralised and grass -root planning. Detailed village-wise information is collected by Investigators/Statistical Assistants posted at the block level. On the basis of the information collected by the Investigators, Village Directory and Block-at-a-glance for each district of the state are prepared and published from time to time. As directed by Planning Commission, Govt. of India, Village Directories of each district of the State have been placed on web site since 1998-99. Block-wise indicators of Socio-economic development (Rural) are also prepared yearly. Critical Indicators of Punjab and All India are also being prepared. Besides, these various adhoc surveys as recommended by the State Government from time to time are conducted by this unit.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

#### **1. Village Directory:**

- (a) Village directory for the year 2003-04 of five districts Mansa, Sangrur, Firozpur, Faridkot and Jalandhar were already placed in 2004-05 and the remaining 12 districts Amritsar, Ludhiana, Gurdaspur, Moga, Nawan Shehar, Mukatsar, Fatehgarh Sahib, Kapurthala, Rupnagar, Hoshiarpur, Patiala and Bathinda were computerized & placed on the website of computer cell of Hon'ble Chief Minister after removing discrepancies, data was finalised.
- (b) Village directories of 17 districts for the year 2004-05 were prepared and data of two districts Moga and Bathinda were placed on the website. Villagewise data of 15 districts are being scrutinized.

#### **2. Block -at-a- Glance**

(a) Block at a Glance for the year 2003-04 of all the districts of the State got printed from the press.

(b) Block at a Glance for the year 2004-05 of all the 17 districts of the State were prepare and scrutinized.

### **3. Block Development Indicators**

Block development indicators of all the districts for the year 2004-05 , were received and scrutinised. After removing discrepancies data was finalised.

### **4. Geographical Information System.**

Information regarding Geographical Information System, as per proforma supplied by the department of Science & Technology Government of India was collected from all the Punjab Government offices situated at district, Sub-division & Block level, complete information collected at district level digitalized in the form of C.D's were supplied to Superintending Survey or Geo Spatial Data Centre Survey of India.

### **5. Critical Economic Indicators Punjab Vs India.**

Critical Economic Indicators of Punjab Vs India 2002-03 was prepared and got computerized. Critical Economic Indicators of Punjab Vs. India 2003-04 are being prepared.

### **6. Miscellaneous.**

#### **(a) Computerization of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab**

The work of computerization of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab was started as per Annual Plan with the approval of department of information & Technology.

(b) Information for the year 2005 of Right to Information Act was prepared & supplied to informants.

## **X. DEMOGRAPHY & HOUSING**

Main function of Demography Section is to prepare below given reports.

### **1. Census of Punjab Govt. Employees & Semi- Govt. Employees.**

The information regarding census of Punjab Govt. and Semi-Govt. employees as on 31<sup>st</sup> March is collected every year. Data is compiled according to pay ranges, district-wise ,department – wise ,sex-wise and is published in the form of report annually. The statistics about No. of scheduled castes, backward classes, ex-servicemen, wards of freedom fighter and handicapped employees is also given.

Since March,1993 the information regarding semi- Govt. employees like Boards, Corporation, Municipalities, Municipal Corporations, Market Committees, Improvement Trusts has been incorporated in this publication.

### **2. Municipal Statistics of Punjab:**

In this report the important data of all the Municipal Councils and Municipal Corporations of the State about important census, vital Health, Education, Water-supply, Entertainment facilities, Hotels, Veterinary Hospitals, Bank offices, roads, sports facilities, Diesel, Petrol & Gas facilities etc. is published. The report is published annually.

### **3. Building Material Prices and Wages of Labourer:**

(a) Data regarding building material prices and wages of different types of labourers are collected quarterly from all the districts and after compilation it is sent to National Building Organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

(b) Index number of building construction cost for 17 districts is prepared annually & sent to NBO, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

**4. Private Building Construction and Public Sector Activities:**

The information about private building construction on quarterly basis from different Municipal Councils having population 10,000 and above in the state is collected and organized and sent to NBO, Govt. of India New Delhi.

**5. Population Statistics:**

(a) Statistics of Population are being prepared as per the requirements of the other departments of the State.

(b) Whenever new districts and tehsils are created, the area and population are compiled

(c) according to new organized boundaries, districts, tehsils and villages. Some tables are prepared to include in Statistical Abstract of Punjab every year & other publications.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

**1. Census of Punjab Govt. & Semi-Govt. Employees**

(a) Report as on 31.3.2004 was prepared after the approval of Economic Adviser to Govt. Punjab and got computerized.

(b) Information regarding Census of Punjab Govt. & Semi- Govt. Employees as on 31.3.2005 was collected from all the offices situated at Chandigarh through personal visits and from all the 17 districts through office of the Dy.E.S.A. Data was scrutinised.

(c) Information was collected about 81<sup>st</sup> Amendment of Constitution from various Punjab Govt. offices situated at Chandigarh. It was sent to Social Welfare Department Punjab after compiling.

**2. Municipal Year Book**

(a) Report of Municipal Year Book for the year 2003-04 was prepared and sent for approval of higher officers.

(b) Information regarding Municipal Year Book for the year 2004-05 from 17 districts of the State was received. The information of 4 districts was scrutinized.

**3. Prices of Building Material & Wages of the Labourers.**

(a) Information regarding prices of Building Material and Wages of Labour for the quarter ending 31.3.2005, 30.6.2005, 30.9.2005 and 31.12.2005 has been prepared and sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.

(b) Building Construction Cost Index for the year 2005 has been prepared for 17 districts and sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.

**3. Area & Population Statistics**

On the basis of Census 2001 the Statistics of Area & Population Table No.3.9,3.10,3.11,3.12,3.25, and 3.26 projected population for the year (2002=2011) statewide was prepared and sent for printing in the Statistical Abstract of Punjab.

**XI. IRRIGATION & POWER**

Main Function of Irrigation Section is to prepare below given two reports:

**1. 'Energy Statistics of Punjab'**



In this report district wise and statewide information pertaining to various aspects of energy is disseminated. It contains comprehensive information about consumption, transmission and distribution of electricity, number of transformers, towns and villages electrified, number of gas connections, no of Gobar Gas plants , consumption of petrol, high speed diesel & kerosene oil etc.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

The report for the year 2002-03 got approved from Economic Adviser and then computerized .35 tables for the report 'Energy Statistics 2003-04 were prepared and approved by Economic Adviser to Govt. Punjab .

**2. 'Irrigation, Floods and Water logging Statistics of Punjab'**

This report contains mainly tehsilwise data relating to number of tubewells/pumping sets, net area irrigated, cropwise gross irrigated area and area under different water management schemes. This data is collected from all District Statistical Officers, Director Land Records, Jalandhar and other concerned offices located at Chandigarh.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

The report of 2002-03 was prepared and got approved by Economic Adviser to Govt. Punjab and computerized copy of manuscript sent to Library for record. .

**XII. FARM ACCOUNTS**

This section prepares two reports annually namely-1) Farm Accounts in Punjab and 2) Family Budget of selected cultivators in Punjab. The main objective of these reports is to assess the annual income and expenditure of cultivators in the State. For this purpose one mechanised holding, one semi mechanised holding is selected from each tehsil of the state and one bullock operated holding is selected from each district of the State. During the year 2005-2006 for this purpose 72 mechanised holdings, 72 semi-mechanised holdings and 5 bullock operated holdings were selected. The selected cultivators recorded day to day data related with farming and family income & expenditure in the prescribed proforma.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

**1. Farm Accounts in Punjab:**

Report Farm Accounts in Punjab 2004-2005 prepared and sent to press after getting approval.

**2. Family Budget of selected cultivators in Punjab**

'Family Budget of Selected cultivators in Punjab' 2003-04 printed and sent to press after getting approval.

**XIII. NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY**

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) was started by Govt. of India in 1950 , to collect comprehensive socio-economic data relating to different sectors on National Basis required by Central and State Ministries, Planning commission and other interested organisations. The National Sample Survey (NSS) is a large scale survey Organisation conducted at National level by Govt. of India in the form of successive rounds, each round covering some topics of current interest. The Punjab State joined the scheme on equal matching basis during 14<sup>th</sup> round in the year 1958-59. The objective of collection of data through NSS scheme is first to obtain exclusive sample results for the State of Punjab for its onward transmission to NSSO (Govt. of India) for pooling of Central and State sample results and secondly to provide statistical information to various Government departments as and when required by them.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

During this period field work regarding 4<sup>th</sup> sub/round of 61<sup>st</sup> Round of NSS was started from 1<sup>st</sup> April,2005 to June,2005. Total 108 samples (R-61,U-47) were surveyed and approximately 2130 schedules were filled. Apart from it , 187 samples of 61<sup>st</sup> round were scrutinized . A Training Conference for the 62<sup>nd</sup> round of NSS attended by R.O. and A.R.O. at New Delhi in which detailed discussion was held regarding the data to be collected on different aspects like employment–unemployment, manufacturing enterprises and Household Consumer Expenditure.

On the basis of instruction/guidelines issued in Training Workshop at Jalandhar Regional Office of NSSO (GOI) was attended by Director, Dy.ESA ,R.O. and A.R.O on 27.6.05 to 29.6.05 . A training workshop was organized for the different 8 circles of the State Head Office, Chandigarh 20-21 July, 2005 in Dua Building.

Field survey work of 62<sup>nd</sup> round of NSS was started. A number of 162 urban and 102 rural samples were completed on 31st March, 2006. Approximately 4480 schedules were filled and apart from it 57 samples of 62<sup>nd</sup> round were scrutinized.

Field survey work was also checked by the officers/supervisors from Head Office in the field from time to time and needed guidance was given to the field staff about survey work.

#### **XIV. TABULATION**

Tabulation section tabulates the data of National Sample Survey (State Sample) collected from the field under various rounds. Processing and tabulation of data is done in accordance with the procedure and tabulation plan supplied by the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) Govt. of India, New Delhi.

During the year 2005-2006 following work was done:-

The processing and tabulation of state sample data on socio-economic surveys is lagging behind as there is no hardware /software facilities in this office . It is further clarified that all out efforts are being made for the provision of hardware/software facilities for this purpose from the State Govt.

#### **xv. TRAINING**

The Training Cell was set up in Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1980 on the recommendations of third Conference of Central and State Statistical Organisation held in 2/1977 .The main objective of the said cell is to make the statistical personnel conversant with the concepts, definitions and terminology of the subjects like elementary Statistics, Economics and Mathematics used in the field of statistics.

During this period 71<sup>st</sup> batch of training was conducted specially for the newly recruited Investigators of District level offices from 14.2.2006 to 24.2.2006.Lectures on Economics, Statistics and Mathematics were also prepared for the above said batch. On the completion of training, a test was conducted and result was prepared and put up to E.A. for approval.

#### **XVI. ART**

Main function of the section is to prepare titles, graphical charts/pictogrammes, maps and other visual aids for various publications/reports/folders and brouchers of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab. During the year 2005-06, 50 black and white charts for printing in publications, 4 Black and white title designs including their colour schemes for the publications and 12 multi coloured displaying charts were prepared.

## **XVII. HUMAN DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH & CO-ORDINATION.**

### Work done during the 2005-06

Translation of HDR in Punjabi:- The report was translated into Punjabi by GNDU, Amritsar and was got printed.

Dissemination of HDR: For dissemination of HDR, Punjab, three workshops were held in three Universities of the State namely ( Punjab University, Chandigarh, Punjabi University, Patiala, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar) with the help of UNDP in month of Feb.,2006.

Follow up Action:- Various departments were reported to implement actionable points of the report.

To Strengthen State Plans, Process regarding follow-up action on the report and selection of agency for Livelihood Study out of 8 studies remained under progress.

## **XVIII. ECONOMIC CENSUS**

Economic Census Section has been created to conduct the 5<sup>th</sup> Economic Census in the State of Punjab. Economic Census is a 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme. Economic Census is being conducted under the supervision of Central Statistical Organisation, Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation, Govt. of India, New Delhi. Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab is the nodal agency in Punjab. In this census, official count of all the entrepreneurial units located within the geographical boundaries of the state are made by conducting door to door survey.

### During 2005-06 following work was done:-

Co-ordination has been made with the districts to complete the Economic Census and completed the work of survey for the Economic Census during the months of May & June. A meeting was held on 5.5.05 under the Chairmanship of Secretary Planning, Govt. of Punjab. In this meeting the progress of field work was reviewed. Dy.ESA were asked to co-ordinate with D.C.'s for any obstacle in the work of Economic Census.

According to the N.I.C. (2004 classification) the coding work has been completed for Economic Census Schedules. On the basis of survey final Code Directory was prepared according to the instructions issued by Registrar General of India, New Delhi. Inventory was prepared for the scanning of schedules. Rechecking in some areas of Patiala & Ropar districts was done due to inaccurate results. Material (boxes, envelopes and tape rolls) were sent to the District Statistical Officers for packing the survey schedule. A meeting was held on 31.8.05 under the Chairmanship of Economic Adviser. In this meeting instructions were given to Dy.ESA's (District level) for pre-scanning and scanning of the schedule. Quick results were prepared on the basis of 5<sup>th</sup> Economic Survey and sent to Govt. of India in September,2005. Schedules were transported to the Data Processing Centre, Census Bhawan at Chandigarh in October,2005. After completion of the scanning of schedules, the supervision for work of editing is being provided to all the districts. Lists related to Enumerators/Supervisors and Charge Officers for the honorarium were prepared and the honorarium amount was sent to districts.

## **XIX. Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme**

The Prime Minister on 23<sup>rd</sup> of December,1993 announced the "Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme" (MPLADS) in the Parliament. Pursuant to these guidelines the Department of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Ministry of Planning and

Programme Implementation has been looking after the scheme at all India level. Under this scheme, funds to the tune of Rs. 2.00 crores are allotted to Member of Parliament every year., which are allocated on the basis of recommendation made by the MPs and are spent on development works carried under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner in the respective areas at district level. At the State level, the Department of Planning being declared as Nodal Agency by Govt. of India, to look after/monitor this scheme. Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab (E.S.O.) is performing the duty as state agency under this scheme and maintained liaison with the Deputy Commissioners at the District level and Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation at Govt. of India.

During 2005-06 following work was done:-

**1. CAG Report**

Efforts were made to settle the audit paras based on CAG Reports 1996-97 and 1999-2000 as demanded by MOSPI. Govt. of India.

**2. Working of software**

Efforts continued for the successful working of software monitoring of MPLADS works operational in all the nodal districts.

**3. Public Accounts Committee**

Annotated Reply of Audit paras of Public Accounts Committee meeting held on 25.5.2004 on CAG Report 1996-97 and Annotated Reply of Audit para of the Public Accounts Committee meeting held on 3.8.2004 on CAG Report 1999-2000 (civil) were sent to Public Accounts Committee on 20.4.2003.

All the paras of CAG report 1999-2000(civil) were settled by PAC on 8.11.05

**4. Transfer of Unspent Balance.**

Unspent balance lying in the account of Retired Rajya Sabha members transferred on 2.2.06 with the coordination of Dy.E.S.A's at district level. Further correspondence is also in progress.

**5. Meeting of Secretaries of State Government.**

To review MPLAD Scheme an agenda note based on May,05 progress was prepared in content with a 'Meeting of Secretaries of State Governments' held on 11.7.2005,16.12.2005 & 21.3.2006 at New Delhi.

To review MPLAD at State level an agenda was also prepared for Deputy Commissioners Conference held on 27.7.05,2.3.06 under the Chairmanship of Worthy Chief Secretary and on 31.8.05,8.12.05 under the Chairmanship of Secretary Planning Punjab. Proceedings of the meeting were also prepared.

## **DISTRICT STATISTICAL OFFICES**

The work of each District Statistical Office is supervised by the Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser. These offices help in collection and compilation of primary and secondary data and co-ordinate the statistical activities of various departments at the district level. Deputy Economic & Statistical Advisers-cum-Additional Secretaries play an important role and provide secretariat services to Deputy Commissioners-cum- Secretaries of the District Planning & Development Boards and are fully involved in the formulation and monitoring of progress of the district level plan schemes.
